- When considering the ongoing debate of minor patients being decision-makers in their medical treatment, it is foremost that there be a review of the various components involved in the development of patient autonomy: right to privacy concept, patient rights and protection provisions.
- Patient autonomy for minors has variation from state to state which incorporates some interpretation of the mature minor doctrine and the types of medical services administered to minor patients: general, family planning, religious, and life-threatening (will include case studies)
- Through basic guidance at the federal level, one can expect clearer expectations thus outcomes related to minor patients being allowed to make medical-based decisions for themselves
